

**2026 Jeffrey L. Pressman Awards**  
**Deadline for Submission: February 20, 2026**

The Department of Political Science announces the Summer 2025 Jeffrey L. Pressman Awards for research, travel or internship in US government, politics, law or education. All members of MIT undergraduate classes 2027, 2028, and 2029 are eligible to apply.

Several stipends (maximum \$7000 each) will be awarded to MIT undergraduates for use during the summer to undertake a special project *or* internship in US government, politics, or policy. The project should focus on some legal, political, institutional, or policy issue.

**Application guidelines for research or special project applicants:**

Proposal (3-5 Pages)

1. Completed application form.
2. Describe your project.
  - a. Why are you interested in this topic?
  - b. What is your background in this area?
  - c. How do you propose to complete the research?
  - d. What will this project contribute to your education?
  - e. What will you contribute to the field by completing this research?
2. Include a preliminary budget
3. Letter of recommendation from 1 MIT faculty member (or UROP supervisor or senior administrator at MIT).
4. A current resume.
5. Unofficial transcript.

**Application guidelines for internship applicants:**

Proposal (3-5 Pages)

1. Completed application form.
2. In an essay of 750 words, please describe an issue or policy related to American policy, government, law, or education of interest to you (it is preferable but not required that your topic be related to the internship or research project you wish to pursue). What are the origins of this issue and who are the major stakeholders? What are the implications of various possible resolutions of the issue?
3. In a paragraph of 150 words, describe how an internship or research project funded by a Jeffrey L. Pressman Award would develop and advance your educational and/or career goals.

4. Letter of recommendation (1) from an MIT faculty member or similar.
5. Current resume.
6. Unofficial transcript.
7. Internship offer letter due to Katherine Hoss ([hoss@mit.edu](mailto:hoss@mit.edu)) by May 1 2026 to be eligible for funds
